Strange result with some replacement motor mounts

One of the first things that usually needs to be replaced on a 45 player are the motor mounts. They come in two varieties, tan and black. Somewhere along the way I read that the tan ones are better but for many years the black ones were readily available. Lately I've noticed that after only a couple of years some of the black mounts go bad. They start oozing some type of liquid and the mount gets rock hard. But the really bizarre thing is it usually only happens to one of the three mounts and it is usually in the same mounting position as shown in the pictures. The mounts were purchased at a NJ store which is now out of business. So would like to know if anyone else has come across this phenomenon.

RCA introduced television for the first time and had experimented with the 33rpm record speed during the 30s. Unfortunately the stylus and cartridge design was not quite up to the task yet and it wouldn't be until 1948 when Columbia would overcome the problems. I'm pretty sure this recording is at 78rpm and what a great remembrance from this World's Fair.
